The Pike Township Trustees met in regular session April 7, 2026 for the purpose of conducting the business at hand. The Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by the President Greg Kaffenbarger, with Vice President Adam Steele and Dan Maxson answering the roll call. Also in attendance was Jerry Donnelly, Scott Williams, Nicole LeDent, Bob Miller, Brian and Amy James, Jason Bishop, Jackie Marshall, Matt Jamison and Cheryl Sigler.

All attendees stood for the Pledge of Allegiance.

R# 31 / 2026 APPROVE MARCH 17, 2026 MINUTES

Motion by Mr. Steele seconded by Mr. Maxson to approve the March 17, 2026 meeting minutes. Motion passed.

R# 32/ 2026 PAY BILLS FOR APRIL 2026

Motion by Mr. Maxson, seconded by Mr. Steele to pay bills for April 2026.

Jackie Marshall is attending to discuss the water and sinkhole issue on NW corner of Wrenview. Bob has checked it out and advised the pipe is bad and 6 ' deep, he thought walls would be needed, he did contact the County about fixing it, they said they could do it, but unsure as to a timeframe. The Trustees discussed and agreed that Bob should seek a few quotes from independent contractors. Ms. Marshall is hiring someone to deal with the water issue in her yard and would like the culvert project done before they start her project. Bob will also have Clark Co Soil and Water take a look at it, as Ms. Marshall advised there is a separate water issue out on Hampton Road.

Mr. and Mrs. James are attending to discuss the zoning rule on garage sale signs. They would like the Trustees to consider amending that rule to allow for more and possibly bigger signs. Discussion on this, Trustees advised them of the procedures that are needed to make changes to the zoning rules and regulations. They will check back in a few months to see if the Trustees made a decision.

Mr. Jamison is attending, he is a Trustee and caretaker for the Emmanuel Church Cemetery at 0 Ansbaugh Road since 2011. The Association would like to deed the property over to the Township. This would be an active cemetery. There are 70 lots are sold and unused, possibly 120 could become available. The Trustees advised they will check into what the next step would be. Cheryl made a copy of the plot map.

Motion by Mr. Steele seconded by Mr. Maxson to approve the purchase of 200 tons rock salt for the 2026/2027 season. Cheryl will submit the tonnage.

Bob advised the roads that he wants to chip & seal this year are School, Sigler and Sunrise, along with some skin patching and the roads do not need much crack fill, he has a skid of material left over from 2025, he is concerned that if he does not buy any product, we might not get free use of the crack fill machine. The Trustees advised him if he needs to rent the machine, that would be OK. Bob is also waiting on a quote to chip & seal the front half of the firehouse parking lot. He would like to purchase some grass matting for School Road, he plans to get that tomorrow.

Nicole advised the Sams Club membership is increasing to \$ 120 from \$ 110 and the FH dryer is on the fritz.

Scott advised 153 runs to date, 28 since last meeting and no mutual aids. Lifeline representative came out to see about rechassisising the box on Medic 253, he advised they cannot do it but could sub contract it out as long as it is doable. He is still researching it. Scott advised the need for a new drill and needles.

R# 36 / 2026 PURCHASE DRYER FOR THE FH FROM LOWES NOT TO EXCEED \$ 600




R# 37 / 2026 ADOPT PIKE TOWNSHIP CYBER POLICY
